Reporting to the Waterfront Director, The Waterski Director is ultimately responsible for all aspects of safety, instruction and management of the Beber Camp waterski program and fleet. Every summer, Beber Camp delivers a world class skiing experience for our campers, supported by 10 inboard ski boats and 6 boat drivers.

Summer Responsibilities

- ***Participants and Program***
 - Implement and support a safety culture for your staff, campers, and all participants
 - Train, motivate and evaluate the waterski team to ensure the highest levels of instruction and coordinate and deliver a training program and assume responsibility for the development of the instructors



- Responsible for implementation of USA Waterski curriculum
- Organize skiing lists, making sure all campers have opportunity to participate
- Lead a team to set up, pack up, and proactively provide assistance to all campers using the equipment each day
- Responsible for alternative ski schedules due to inclement weather or overflow
- **Boats and Facilities**
 - Serve as point person for all boat maintenance issues.
 - Maintain boating log books per ACA standards
 - Help to coordinate the set up of the docks and boats at the start of the season and the pack down of the camp at the end of the season
- **Administration**
 - Organize a working schedule for drivers
 - Report all purchasing requests to waterfront director
 - Serve as assistant to Waterfront Director when needed
 - Oversee the security of camp equipment and the satisfactory appearance of boats, docks, and waterfront to ensure the meeting of camp expectations
 - Develop positive working relationships with all departments
 - Be flexible in your job role and willing to assist in all other duties, within reason, as requested by your manager according to training you have been given
 - Present a professional appearance and attitude at all times, and maintain an excellent standard of customer service

POSITION REQUIREMENTS

- 3+ years previous supervisory and management experience
- Must reside in the local area

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS

- Ability to stoop, kneel, bend, reach, stand, walk, pull, lift, work with fingers, grasp, feel, talk, hear and perform repetitive motions
- The employee must regularly lift and/or move up to 25 pounds, frequently lift and/or move up to 50 pounds and occasionally lift and/or move up to 100 pounds.
- Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, distance vision, and color vision
